MarriedLife HOME SECURITY Installation STEP 1: Home Evaluation


STEP 1: Home Evaluation

STEP 2: Install Motion Detectors

Lay your **Motion Detector** list on the table. Ask each other the questions below. (As you are answering the questions, you will probably get frustrated with your spouse. Therefore, you are allowed to hit your spouse once with a throw pillow.)

- What are the three chores you enjoy the most? (Relatively speaking, of course)
- Act out (charades) the three chores you wish would magically disappear.
- What are the three chores (if any) you feel take too much time and energy to complete? Why? Do you feel there are chores that could be cut out all together? Why?
- Are there any chores we could afford to pay someone else to do? If not, do you think it would be worth giving up something else in order to have the extra money to pay for outside help?
- Say to your spouse: "Since you dislike (chore), I will be responsible to make sure it gets done for the next month."

To express gratitude for all the chores your spouse does around the house (relatively speaking, of course), turn up the music and do a 30-second dance.





STEP 3: Install Entry Point Sensors

In order for our homes to be secure, we have to "sensor" who and what comes in and out of our home. Our work, schedules and household chores can be the intruders that rob our home life of what it should be. We must beat our work and schedules at their own game, we must let these intruders know we are....

ALARMED AND DANGEROUS

The object of the "Alarmed and Dangerous" game is to get to your home before *The Intruder*. Use the scorecard on the next page to total the points from the instructions below. Who will make it home first... *Mr. & Mrs. You or The Intruder?*

- 1. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you have a set time every day when you stop doing work in order to enjoy being home. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.
- 2. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you don't allow home or cell phones to intrude on your quality time at home. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you do.

- 3. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you stop and greet each other when you get home. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.
- 4. Award Mr. & Mrs. You 6 points for having this date.
- 5. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you have a sit down meal together at least twice a week. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.
- 6. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you have a set time every day when you stop doing chores in order to enjoy being home. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.
- 7. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 4 points if you have something fun you do together every week (e.g., watch movie, take a walk, play outside). Award *The Intruder* 4 points if you don't.
- 8. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 4 points if you only go to church, rest or play on Sunday. If you're that much like God, go ahead and award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 more points! Award *The Intruder* 6 points if you don't.
- 9. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you have a weekly date at home or out. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.
- 10. Award *Mr. & Mrs. You* 2 points if you intentionally leave some blank space on your calendar to just enjoy being home. Award *The Intruder* 2 points if you don't.


